Hello to everyone.

We hope this letter finds you all well. A couple of months have gone since, we sent a letter off and this may be perhaps the one to end the year. So here it is.

Nathan was able to come over during the last semester break and spend some weeks with us and recover from his Rugby league injury. It was good to be all in one place just for that time. We travelled to Perth and spent some time there, while Theresa attended a workshop, we then saw Nathan off and returned.

We are almost at the end of a very relaxing and quiet holiday in Gibson. Narelle and George spent the holidays at the beach swimming or as Nathan called it "ice bath" referring to swimming in the cooler waters of the southern ocean here in Esperance or fishing or enjoyed the rides on the 4 wheeler on the farm.

Narelle drove the bike and George was happy to hang on tight and happily go on the rides, they had lots of fun. We travelled to Kalgoorlie (a Mining city like Mt Isa in Queensland) which is 400 kms from Gibson and Esperance and spent two nights for medicals. For a change, we ate out. We had meals at Maccas/KFC or Eagle Boys. It was a special treat for Narelle and George.

The students will all be here in a couple of day's time. This term will be a short one but a very busy one for all of us. Peer pressure is world wide and the Indigenous teenagers are not exempted, please, pray for those who claim to be Christians to continue their walk with God as they complete their studies.. It is not easy. Many girls look forward to coming back to school. Pray that with God's wisdom, we will prepare this place as home when they return.

Each year, twelve students are given the reward of completing two to three years (three years if accepted for school based traineeship) to go on an overseas mission trip. Last year it was suggested that this mission trip will be **to Londua training college on Ambae Island in Vanuatu**. The staff and students will travel with Allen and Lynne Cox from Buderim in Queensland.

Since 2008, Allen and Lynne have been blessed and led by the Lord for this vital ministry to the body of Christ in Vanuatu. They have been challenging the church in Australia to support the work of rebuilding this VET school in Vanuatu. Students from different Islands go and train there. and are in the work force in Vanuatu. You will find many Christian leaders today in different sectors of work, in Vanuatu who had been to that school over the years. The different churches in Australia have sent teams across to Londua and a lot of maintenance work has been done but there is still more to be done yet. There are eleven people going from here; eight students and four staff members to help in a small way with the on going project. We fly out to Vanuatu on 12th of Nov. and return to Brisbane 22nd of Nov. and Auntie Carol Sese has taken leave without pay from work and will come over from Port Villa earlier to settle in and will be with George and Narelle as they go to school in that period of time that we are away. Carol has graciously done this, in our time of need over the years that we have been in Australia. We may not be asking this favour for too long. We thank God for those who supported to help us to bring Carol over. This will be a very busy time of returning to complete whatever we have to do at school, before graduation which would be a couple of days after we return.

the students will have two days there before we return to Perth on 26th.

We have shared with the leadership in AICF (Aboriginal Islander Christian Fellowship,) that we will remain in Wongutha and return to work with AICF ministry wherever the Lord leads and so, at this time we will still be here in 2010. We will be here in WA for Christmas as a family and Nathan has said that he will come over for Christmas after some weeks of work after Uni. Nathan was offered a job but after praying he has decided to continue at Uni for one more year. George has accomplished a major hurdle of his life, in swimming six (6) laps in the local swimming pool, his teachers were just "over the moon". Bless his heart. His mum was of course, on the side of the pool very emotional and George was just George enjoying water and swimming his heart out.
